# **Pastor's Message**

#### Rosary Devotion: A Powerful Armor

We are blessed to launch our Parish Bulletin in October, a month dedicated to Rosary devotion. The Rosary, the most powerful prayer next to Holy Mass is truly a special prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of spiritual blessings in the journey of our Christian life. This devotion although Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer, with all the elements of the Gospel message contained in its entirety. It is through the Rosary that we contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and experience the depths of His love. Rosary Devotions are a set of prayers inviting the faithful to meditate on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Savior with His Blessed Mother.

St. John Paul II in his Apostolic Letter, Rosarium Virginis Mariae, stresses the importance of the Holy Rosary. "Spiritual life is not limited solely to participation in the liturgy. According to the teaching of the Apostle, Christians must pray without ceasing (1Thes 5:17). The Rosary is part of this varied panorama of "ceaseless" prayer. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace through the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer".

The faithful are encouraged to pray the entire Rosary - The Joyful, Luminous, Sorrowful and Glorious mysteries each and every day. In


today's busy world, such a task may seem impossible or highly improbable. But no matter what your schedule is, there is a way to accomplish praying all four sets of mysteries every day. Begin by first dividing the Rosary mysteries into four parts throughout the day. Reciting one quarter of the Rosary throughout the day is much better than reciting it all at once. To make it even easier, break it down into individual decade recitations. Consider those opportunities in your schedule where you can recite one decade at a time. One can pray the Rosary anywhere: while driving or walking, on the subway, in the work place, with the company of others and at home with the family. Thus devotion to the Rosary is easily adaptable in our modern and hectic lifestyles.

As history has shown, the Rosary was used by the Dominicans at a difficult time of the Church due to the spread of heresy. We in our day-to-day lives face number of challenges, so let us entrust ourselves to Mother Mary with trust, confidence and faith to face these challenges with audacity and hope. I urge all the Family Unit Coordinators to make the necessary arrangements to recite the Rosary devoutly in the month of October in your respective Family Units.

I sincerely thank Mr. Cherian Manathara, the Chief Editor and the entire team for their committed effort in the timely publication of this Bulletin. I hope it will provide the parishioners with the necessary information they need in the task of building the parish community and making it more spirit-filled and vibrant. #### **SPIRITUAL**

The Spiritual Ministry strives to facilitate an environment characterized by gospel values that nurtures meaningful relationships amongst parishioners; enrich family relationships through retreats, formation programs, and activities; and bring the parish community together in prayer. There are many opportunities for our parish community to come together to celebrate their faith in addition to coming for Sunday mass. Some of the highlights are:

- 1. During the month of August 2014, Jesus Youth hosted a National Conference. Over 600 people, many of whom were families and youth from our parish, attended the conference and thoroughly enjoyed the workshops and fellowship. After the conference, a group of youth from our parish attended a 5-day residential Jesus Youth Discipleship Training Program at Niagara Falls.
- Our annual retreat is being held from October 11th to 13th at The Meeting House (located at 2700 Bristol Circle, Oakville). The adult retreat is being led by Rev. Fr. Xavier Khan Vattayil while the youth retreat is being led by Rev. Fr. Soji Olickal, Rev.Fr. Hansoo Park, and team.

#### Highlights of Achievements:

- Created a Catechetical administrative system. Developed the vision and mission for the department. Elected members for the core catechetical committee.
- Laid the foundation stone for a systematic and organized way to conduct the ongoing faith education in our children and young adults. Developed the Catechetical Diary to be used as a communication tool for parents, teachers and children.
- The diary was officially released by Fr. Jose Kalluvelil on the first day of Catechism i.e., 7th September 2014, to the parents who were first to register their children for the 2014-2015 Catechism academic year.
- Organized teachers training programs and initiated programs to coach and assist teachers on an ongoing basis to foster continuous faith education.
- Established the Pious Association and nominated Catechism teachers with special responsibilities to engage our children and guide them to participate effectively in various parish activities.

#### Plans ahead and Focus Areas:

 The elected office bearers of the PTA (Parent Teacher Association) Mr. Sajimon Thomas - President and Thomas Varghese - Secretary will work on developing and strengthening the family apostolate through the family units along with those who serve as catechists in our parish programs.

- We are working to set up a strong Resource Team to support our faith education in order to strengthen the family apostolate.
- Catechism Teacher's staff meeting will be held on October 19 to encourage and nurture continuous communication.

#### PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION

**Mission:** Planning and Construction committee is created with a mission to have a strategic view of our church building project. This committee will study, discuss, debate and recommend specific strategies to the parish council for approval. The committee will have a strategic view of community based on our spiritual, social, cultural frameworks.

Activities: The committee has already met two times to discuss and update on the current status of the church building project. The first meeting was held on 1st July 2014 at the Mission House. During this meeting, the members were given a detailed update on the on going church building project with specific information on regulatory requirements, estimate cost, timeline and milestones. In the last meeting, held on 4th September 2014, the committee actively debated on the options available to realize our goals. Without sufficient capital fund, we will not be able to initiate any activities towards our dream of owning our own place of worship. Accordingly, with a given timeline of two years, the committee recommended to initiate fund raising plan for the church building project at the earliest. The committee is scheduled to meet on October 16, for another discussion on this topic and would provide a specific actionable plan for approval to the parish council and pothuyogam.

# Popular Saints of the Month - October



St.Theresa of the Child Jesus Feast: October 1

St. Theresa of the Child Jesus, often called the Little Flower, was born in Normandy, France, in 1873. She used to say after my death, I will let fall a shower of roses. I will spend my heaven doing good on earth." The Little Flower died on September 30, 1897. She was proclaimed a saint by Pope Pius XI in 1925. She also proclaimed as Universal Patron of the Missions, and Doctor of the Universal Church. Reflection: "O Jesus, my love, my vocation, at last I have found it. My vocation is LOVE!"



Guardian Angels Feast: October 2

In 1608, Pope Paul V added October 2nd as a feast of Guardian Angels to the calendar of saints and celebrations. It is very encouraging to know and believe that we each have an angel guarding and protecting us. Our guardian angel is a gift from our loving God. We can say this brief prayer as often as we would like to throughout the day: Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love entrusts me here. Ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.



St. Francis Assisi Feast: October 4

St. Francis Assisi, Founder of the Franciscan Order, born at Assisi in Umbria, in 1181. He gave up all his possessions to become the servant of God. He began by praying more and making sacrifices to grow strong in spirit. As a reward for his great love, Jesus gave him his own wounds in his hands and feet. Reflection: Francis followed the example of Jesus closely by living a life of simplicity and teaching others the Gospel message with great joy.



St. Teresa of Avila Feast: October 15

Teresa died at Alba de Tormes, 4 Oct., 1582. In her self, in her prayer, in her life, in her efforts to reform, in all the people she touched, she was a woman for others, a woman who inspired and gave life. Her writings, especially the Way of Perfection and The Interior Castle, have helped generations of believers. In 1970, the Church gave her the title she had long held in the popular mind: Doctor of the Church.

Kunjachan was a priest who dedicated himself to the spiritual and temporal welfare of a marginalised set of people who were poor and exploited for generations. He preached to them the love of Jesus and made them experience the tender care of the Heavenly Father by his self-emptying life. The feast of Blessed Kunjachan is on 16 October.

St. Jude is invoked in desperate situations because his New Testament letter stresses that the faithful should persevere in the environment of harsh, difficult circumstances, just as their forefathers had done before them. Therefore, he is the patron saint of desperate cases and his feast day is October 28.
